Responsibilities include:

- Oversee the daily clinical operations of the ED with a yearly volume of 36K patients and the Ambulatory Care Center with a yearly volume of 35K
- Serve as a member of the planning team for the newly built expanded Urgi Care Center that will replace the current Ambulatory Care Clinics
- Responsible for clinical competence of nursing and ancillary staff of both the ED and the current Ambulatory Care Center and future Urgi Center
- Lead, mentor, develop, and guide clinical and ancillary staff
- Assist with culture change to improve patient and employee satisfaction
- Improve patient flow for better patient care and satisfaction
- Work with staff to improve quality indicators
- Establish and monitor clinical goals

- Collaborate with Medical Director of the ED and Ambulatory Care Clinics n clinical decisions regarding patient care and staff competence
- Manage business activities to include performance management
- Responsible for yearly and capital budgets for both areas
- Responsible for compliance with state and federal governing agencies
- Ensure Quality and Safety by organizing PI activities
