What is Project ECHO Opioid Use Disorder Treatment for Behavioral Health Providers?

It is a **free tele-mentoring program** that provides training in Opioid Use Disorder treatment to behavioral health providers. **Videoconferencing (Zoom)** will be used to deliver:

- **Practical didactics** on Opioid Use Disorder Treatment
- **Case discussions** using cases that participants submit
- **Support from peers and experts** within and outside of Montefiore
- **Free CE/CEU credits** for Social Workers, Mental Health Counselors, and Nurses
