About This Training

Depression Screening & Management Using Measurement Base Collaborative Care is designed for primary care providers, care managers and behavioral health providers to increase their knowledge and self-confidence in screening for and managing major depressive disorder using the PHQ9, measurement-based care and the collaborative care model. The module uses a longitudinal series of annotated video case vignettes to demonstrate effective communication skills, and the Collaborative Care Model in action.



Learning Objectives

- Examine reasons why it is important to screen for depression in general medical settings
- Discuss the various roles of Collaborative Care team members to foster effective collaboration in order to maximize the care of patients with depression
- Demonstrate the use of the PHQ2 and PHQ9 to screen for depression, monitor treatment response
- Illustrate measurement-based care to maximize the care of patients with depression
- Evaluate active suicidality with the use of the P4 Screener
- Demonstrate the use of depression education, self-management support strategies including brief action planning, and shared decision-making tools to guide antidepressant choice conversations
